CONFERENCE GOALS

The coastal zone attracts many uses, such as fishery, recreation and tourism, industry and transportation, different types of development that are compatible only to a limited extent. An increased human use of the coastal zone carries the risk of a substantial reduction of the coastal zone to deliver ecosystem out, especially on Natural Parks and protected areas. The coastal zone is thus a scene on which a variety of conflicts are being played out, where compromises are being achieved between different social goals such as sustainability, economic efficiency and equity, and where various property-rights regimes take place.

The objective of this conference is to promote international exchange of knowledge between researchers, managers and technicians, as well as professionals working in coastal zones conservation and management. The Conference also aims to share experiences and promote new working relations.

Author(s) should identify the theme most appropriate to their paper. Author(s) will be notified of preliminary acceptance. Final acceptance will be based on the Conference fee final payment. Instructions on the format of paper and a copyright release form will be sent to the authors. Submission of the final paper is understood to be a firm commitment to attend ICCCM 2005. Presentations should be applicable to a multi-disciplinary audience. Accepted papers will be published in the Conference proceedings after the congress. There will be a special edition of Journal for Coastal Conservation with selected papers. Authors wishing to present by poster are requested to indicate this on their abstract.
